Three New Board Members to Serve PMI Educational Foundation



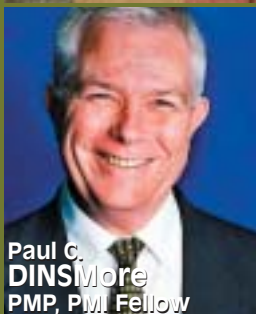

The PMI Educational Foundation (PMIEF) welcomes three new members to its board of directors in 2006. Debbie O'Bray and Karen White, PMP, were appointed by the PMI Board of Directors, and William Moylan, PhD, PMP, FESD, was elected by the PMIEF board. The Foundation has also named board member Beth Partleton, PMP, its new chair.

Another change in the PMIEF board was the departure of Paul C. Dinsmore, PMP, PMI Fellow, who left the board in 2005 after serving two three-year terms, the maximum allowed. Mr. Dinsmore was honored at PMI Global Congress 2005—North America in Toronto, where he was recognized for his service to the board.

Ms. O'Bray, a former PMI Board chair and a six-year member of the PMI Board, also serves as chair of the PMI Ethics Standard Development Committee. Ms. O'Bray was a founder and officer in the PMI Manitoba Chapter, and an active member of the Council of Chapter Presidents. She also participated in the PMI Standards Committee and Technical Advisory Center. She has over 20 years experience in telecommunications and over 10 years experience as a project management consultant in the areas of aerospace, new product development, environmental engineering and finance.

Ms. White just completed her term as chair of the PMI Ethics Review Committee. She is a past PMI Board member and has received the PMI Distinguished Contribution Award. Additionally, she served as a member of the PMI Awards Advisory Group and the PMI 2000 Member Advisory Group. She is employed as a director in PM Solutions' Professional Services division.

Dr. Moylan was a member of the Certification Board Center (now the Certification Governance Council), a volunteer team leader of the group that developed Certificates of Added Qualification, and a member of the PMP Certification Exam Committee. He was a founder and chair of the PMI Manufacturing Specific Interest Group and co-chair of the Assembly of SIG Chairs. Dr. Moylan is a recipient of the PMI Distinguished Contribution Award, and was awarded a PMI Fellow

Scholarship by the PMIEF in 2004. Dr. Moylan consults, trains, educates, provides expert witness testimony, and practices professional project management and construction engineering. At present he is on the full-time faculty of Eastern Michigan University's College of Technology, where he instructs in construction management.

Ms. Partleton is currently the Director of Program Management and Facilities Engineering with Miller Brewing Company. She was the project manager for the 1997 PMI Seminars & Symposium in Chicago and received the Distinguished Contribution Award in 1998.
