



Foundation Expands Scholarship Opportunities

Not-for-profits, Nongovernmental Organizations and Teachers *Now Included*

Do you know a teacher who can benefit from project management? How about a not-for-profit organization?

The PMI Educational Foundation (PMIEF) has announced that Cheetah Learning will donate up to 20 project management training scholarships per quarter through the PMI Educational



Foundation for five years. This scholarship program helps not-for-profits, nongovernmental organizations and teachers learn the fundamentals of project management through Cheetah Learning's PM Fundamentals online certificate program.

For participants who are awarded these training scholarships, there is no cost to take this online training program, valued at US\$3,250 per class. The program also includes preparation for and the examination for the PMI Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM)® credential.
