Below is a sampling of the work we've accomplished around the globe.

NORTH AMERICA – USA, Canada

Generous donations from 5 PMI R.E.P.s and 36 PMI components helped PMIEF provide the following:

- 7 Financial Grants in 6 U.S. states
- 73 Academic Scholarships in 26 U.S. states and 3 Canadian provinces
- 6 Student Paper Awards in 4 U.S. states and 1 Canadian province
- 8 Training Scholarships in 8 U.S. states
- Resources in 49 U.S. states and 7 Canadian provinces

USA Washington

Grants to develop material and provide training for 107 Local Disaster Relief/Recovery Workers in 31 countries including but not limited to: Myanmar, Philippines, Uganda, Cameroon, UK

USA Oregon

Grant to fund school-based PM program

USA Louisiana

A Katrina survivor is using the PMMPDR "to enhance my skills in project management"

USA Washington, D.C.

Two groups of youths at a juvenile detention center discovered project management as a career option, thanks to a PMI Washington, DC Chapter member, who described the experience as "one of the most enjoyable days of my year"

Brazil

- Use PM Skills for Life with NGOs, São Paulo
- Use PMMPDR to train NGOs responding to the flooding disaster, Santa Catarina
- Use PM Toolkit for Youth to develop a secondary school program and in other areas in Brazil to teach PM to young children in small communities, Rio

USA Maine, Pennsylvania, Maryland

Four grants to incorporate PM training for unemployed workers, to create workshops for NGOs and teachers and research

USA Eastern Pennsylvania

The PMI Delaware Valley Chapter brought project management into the classroom in two secondary schools. Volunteers from the chapter helped create the curriculum, teach the course, mentor the students, and work with the teachers

Ghana

Grant to a girls' school to incorporate PM training into 21st Century Skills course

Nigeria

- PM Skills for Life – NGOs doing water projects and NGOs working with abused women
- The PM Toolkit for Youth with secondary and primary schools

Germany, Switzerland, Poland

PM Toolkit for Youth is being presented by individuals for use by schools in Germany and Switzerland as well as with volunteer projects with Scouts in Poland

The PMMPDR is being used:

In **India** by organizations engaged in rebuilding areas affected by the tsunami that swept through the coastal areas of South India

In **Taiwan** by a Typhoon Morakot survivor to "learn more...to prepare for disasters" because, he says, "the rescue and recovery processes are still not good enough"

In **Myanmar** by Cyclone Nargis project teams

In **Sri Lanka** by an experienced disaster relief worker to enhance his knowledge in post-disaster reconstruction

Saving Lives in the Face of Tragedy with Project Management

USA Washington

When natural and man-made disasters strike, saving lives and providing basic necessities such as food and water require a rapid and organized response. Through a grant to PM4NGOs, PMIEF helped fund the creation of specialized project management training for front-line NGO disaster relief workers that enables them to respond more efficiently and effectively during emergencies.



Brazil

The PMI São Paulo Chapter is using the PM Skills for Life to train coordinators of CIEDEF, a large Brazilian NGO, to provide them with the knowledge and tools they need to succeed in their projects with their local Brazilian Paralympic Committee, which believes in providing disabled people with access to sports. Brazil is one of the top 10 paralympic medalist countries.



India

Since 2008, the PMI Mumbai Chapter, with the help of volunteers and logistical support from corporate partners, has trained more than 25 local grass roots NGOs in project management using PMIEF's PM Skills for Life and Careers in PM as well as PMI's PMBOK® Guide and is helping them better understand best practices in project management and benchmarking their own practices.



South Africa

PM4Africa in collaboration with a Du Noon HIV/AIDS NGO Organizational Capability Project is building capacity at a Du Noon soup kitchen using the PM Skills for Life to teach project management as a life skill. PM4Africa is also teaching individuals how to build their own structurally sound houses, using project management skills, and is working in schools and with other NGOs.
